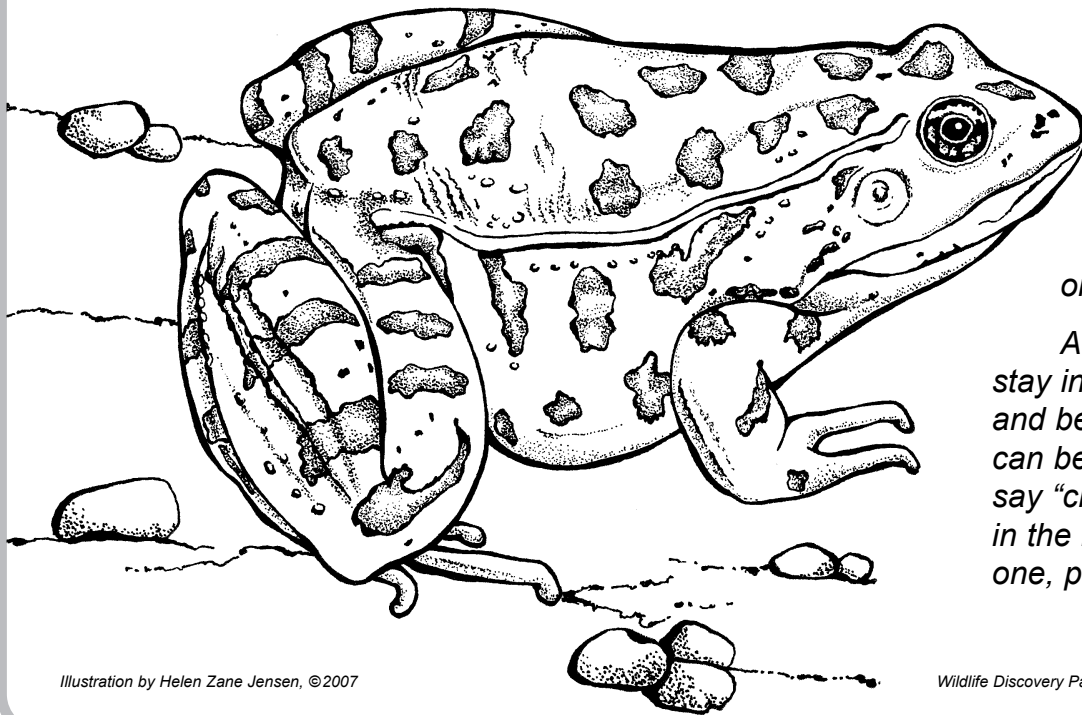
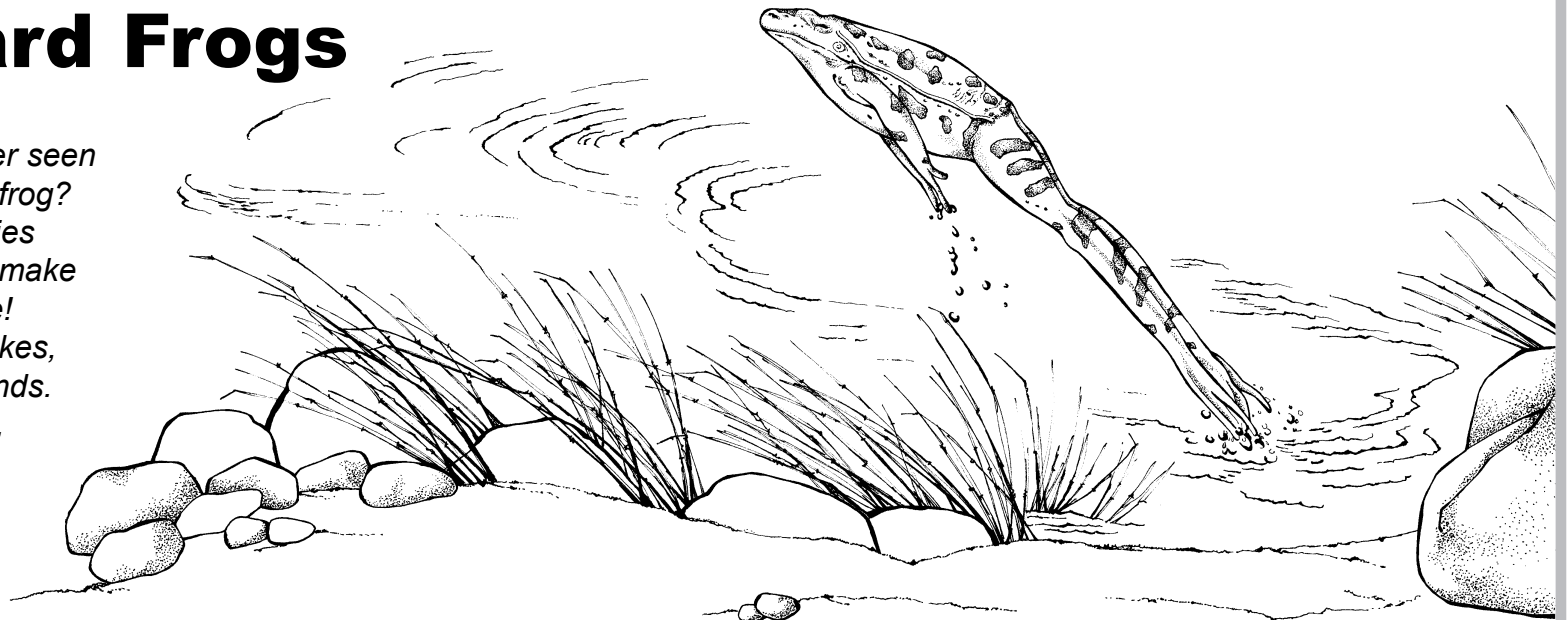


Leopard Frogs

Have you ever seen a plains leopard frog? Their brown bodies with black spots make them hard to see! They live near lakes, streams, and ponds. They eat insects, spiders, and even snails.



Frogs lay their eggs in water. They can lay thousands of eggs at once! Many eggs will not survive. Fish and other animals eat the eggs. The ones that survive become tadpoles.

A tadpole is a baby frog with a tail and no legs. They stay in the water until they grow their legs, lose their tail, and become adult frogs. Watching leopard frogs can be a lot of fun. They swim and hop and say "chuck chuck chuck." They're happiest in the meadows and streams. If you see one, please leave it in its home.
