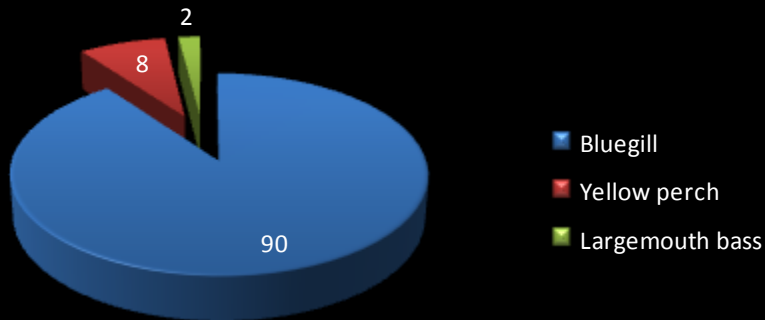

Lambertson Lake 2008 Fish Survey



Percent Relative Abundance

The figure to the left shows the percent relative abundance of the most abundant species in Lambertson Lake. Surveys here include the use of boat electrofishing. The 2008 results show that bluegill comprised the largest percentage (90%) of the species present, followed by yellow perch (8%) and largemouth bass (2%). The abundance of bluegill and yellow perch make this an ideal lake for kids to catch enthusiastic panfish.

The figure below shows the length frequencies of bluegill, yellow perch, and largemouth bass at Lambertson Lake. The vertical bars represent the number of fish at a particular length. Although the bluegill and yellow perch are not large here, the abundance of smaller fish will keep a budding angler busy all day. The presence of largemouth up to 14" provides the opportunity for a memorable fishing day for any young angler.
