



Ruedi Reservoir

Fish Management and Survey Information

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General Information: Ruedi Reservoir is a 1,000 acre storage reservoir. Ruedi offers good fishing for rainbow trout, lake trout, and occasionally kokanee. Recreation facilities consist of 4 campgrounds accommodating 81 campsites and 2 boat-launching ramps. Location: Eagle and Pitkin counties. Ruedi is located 15 miles east of Basalt on the Fryingpan Road.

REGULATIONS

- Statewide bag and possession limits apply: 4 trout daily bag, 8 trout possession; 10 kokanee bag and possession.
- Use or possession of live fish as bait is prohibited west of the continental divide except in Navajo Reservoir.

Ice fishing is allowed.

BOAT INSPECTION & DECONTAMINATION

- Weekends from May 27th - September 5th.
- Hours of operation:
 - Fridays: 12 noon - 7 PM
 - Saturdays and Holiday Weekend Sundays: 8 AM - 8 PM
 - Sundays: 8 AM - 2 PM
 - Holiday Weekend Mondays: 8 AM - 2 PM
- Location: base of the campground/boat ramp entry road at Ruedi Creek.
- Requirements: The boat ramp will be open for use on weekdays and after hours on weekends and boaters are required to have valid green seal and receipt from another certified state location prior to launch.

SPORTFISHING NOTES

Lake Trout

- Lake trout are naturally reproducing in the lake and are available for harvest.
- They are often found in deep waters near the dam during the summer.

Rainbow Trout

- Rainbow trout fishing is good year round using traditional baits.

Kokanee Salmon

- Fishing for kokanee is rebounding after a short period of not stocking.
- The inlet is a good fishing location for kokanee during the fall.

Yellow Perch

- Illegally introduced into Ruedi, we encourage removal of any perch caught. There is no bag or possession limit on the western slope.

Management Notes – Ruedi is stocked with approximately thousands of catchable rainbow trout each year. There is a naturally reproducing population of lake trout. Kokanee are also annually stocked in Ruedi. In 2007, an illegally introduced population of yellow perch was first sampled in Ruedi. Yellow perch compete for plankton that serve as a food source for kokanee and young trout. Furthermore, larger perch will directly predate on other young fish that may be desirable to anglers as adult fish. Because Ruedi is a relatively unproductive reservoir due to natural environmental conditions, it is important to remove perch to reduce competition for the limited resources. We encourage anglers to remove any perch that they catch while fishing at Ruedi.
