



2010 Hybrid Draw FAQ

HYBRID DRAWING

In an effort to expand quality opportunities to big game hunters, the Colorado Division of Wildlife has established a "Hybrid" drawing for select deer, elk, pronghorn, and bear licenses for the 2010 hunting seasons. The purpose of the drawing is to give hunters the additional opportunity to draw a license for some of the state's premier big game hunting areas. Hunters who normally would not have enough preference points to draw these licenses now have a slight chance to draw a small number of the most coveted licenses through this process.

What hunt codes will be included in the Hybrid draw?

- Those hunt codes requiring 10 or more resident preference points (using a three year average) to draw licenses for deer, elk, pronghorn and bear will be issued through the Hybrid draw. Ranching for Wildlife and private land only licenses are included.
- The following are the only hunt codes that meet the above criteria and will be considered for the 2010 Hybrid draw:

Will this hunt code list change?

- The Wildlife Commission indicated the list of eligible hunts would stay in effect for the current five-year season structure. However, the Wildlife Commission can review this list at anytime.

How many licenses will be issued?

- Up to 20% of the available general quota will be available through the Hybrid draw. (Quota is always rounded down to a whole license unless the result is <1 then zero (0) is allocated).
- Because of the rounding down, some hunt codes may not have enough general quota to have a license available in the Hybrid draw.
- Note: 2010 license quotas will not be adopted by the Wildlife Commission until May 2010.

Who can participate?

- *Resident and nonresident hunters who have a minimum of five preference points for that species and have applied for a hunt code eligible for the hybrid draw as a first choice will automatically be entered into the Hybrid draw.*
- *Only single applicants can participate. If you are part of a group you will not be considered for the Hybrid draw.*

How will it work?

- *The Hybrid draw will occur after the landowner and standard preference point draws.*
- *Winning applicants in the Hybrid drawing will be selected randomly.*
- *Hunters who successfully draw a first choice license in the Hybrid drawing will lose their preference points.*
- *Unsuccessful applicants will be awarded one preference point.*

Do the same rules apply for refunds or preference point reinstatements?

- *Yes, the same rules apply as any other license. If the license is turned in prior to the start of the season the license holder may request a refund or reinstatement of their preference points.*

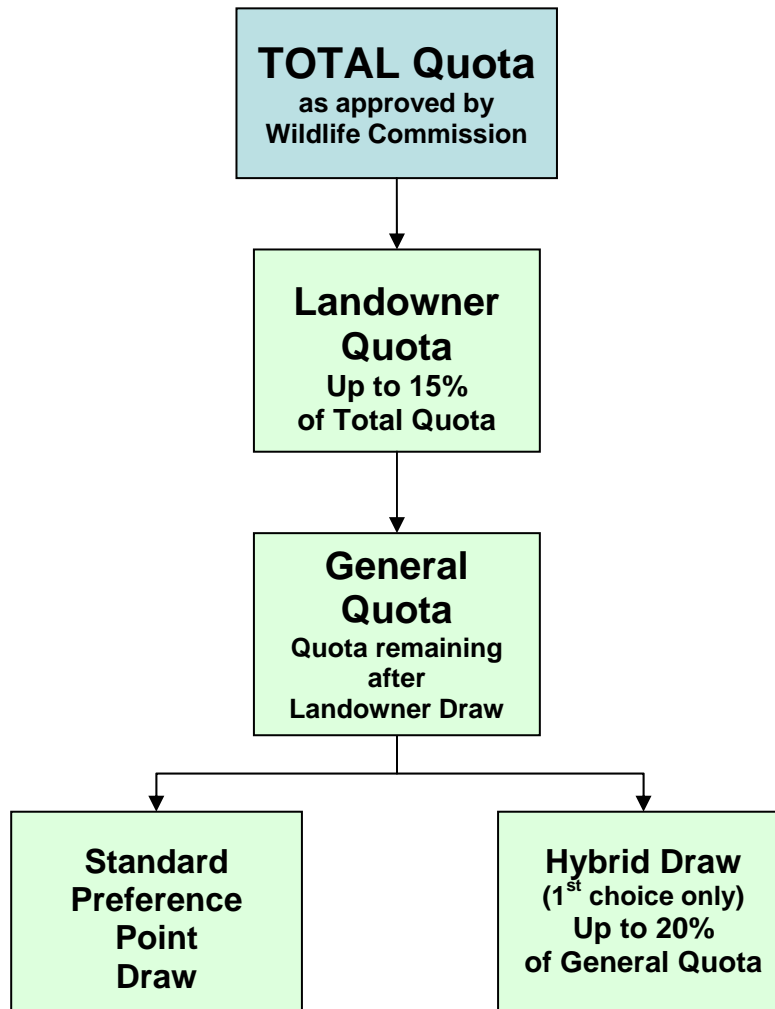
Do the resident/nonresident allocation caps apply to the Hybrid draw?

- *Yes, the 80/20 and 65/35 caps apply to the Hybrid draw.*
 - *Nonresident allocation caps are defined as unless there is an insufficient number of resident applications, nonresident hunters shall receive no more than 35% of available deer and elk licenses for hunt codes requiring fewer than six preference points for resident hunters to draw in the regular drawing and no more than 20% of available deer and elk licenses for hunt codes requiring six or more preference points for resident hunters to the regular drawing. The number of preference points required to draw shall be determined by an average of the 2007, 2008 and 2009 draw results.*

Can nonresidents draw a Ranching for Wildlife license in the Hybrid draw?

- *No, public Ranching for Wildlife licenses are available only to residents.*

How Quota will be Allocated through the 2010 Hybrid Draw:



- Quota for Landowner Preference is calculated off of the Total Quota approved by the Wildlife Commission. Any quota remaining after the Landowner Preference drawing goes into the General Quota.
- The General Quota is the Total Quota minus the licenses drawn in the Landowner draw. The quota allocated to the Hybrid Draw is calculated off of the General Quota.
- Quota is always rounded down to a whole license unless the result is <1 then zero (0) is allocated.
- Nonresident allocation is not set aside at the beginning of the draws, therefore the number of nonresident licenses available in the Hybrid Draw cannot be calculated prior to the draws. Nonresident allocation is a “running calculation” that is calculated throughout the Youth Preference, Standard Preference Point and Hybrid Draws.
- Example of quota allocation for a Hybrid Draw hunt based on 2009 quota:
EE201E1R
 - Total Quota = 27
 - Landowner Preference = 4 ($27 \times 15\% = 4.05$)
 - Standard Preference Point Draw = 19 (General Quota ($27 - 4$ landowner) - Hybrid = 19)
 - Hybrid Draw = 4 ($23 \times 20\% = 4.6$)

When will Nonresidents Reach Their Allocation in the 2010 Primary Draw?
