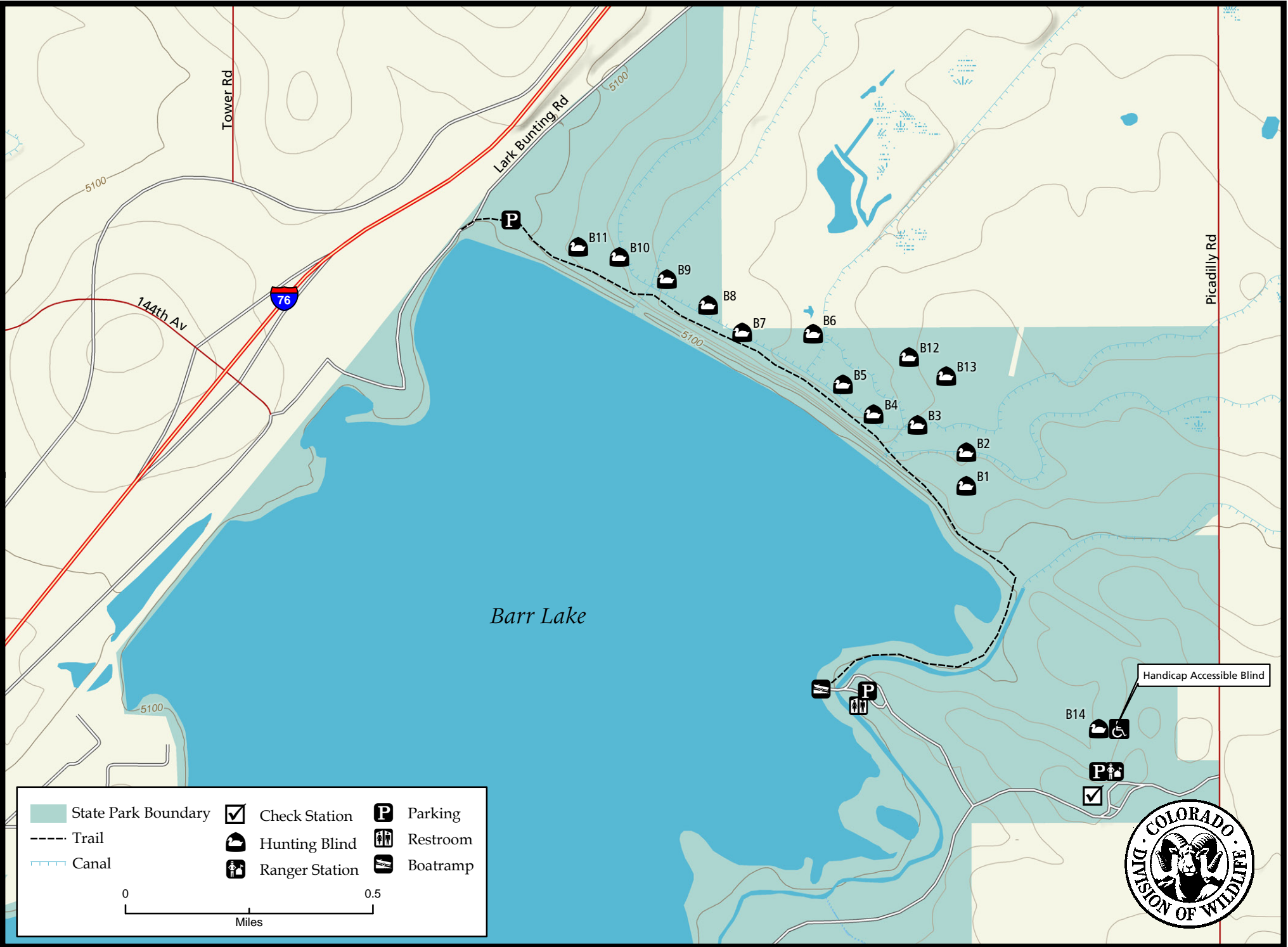
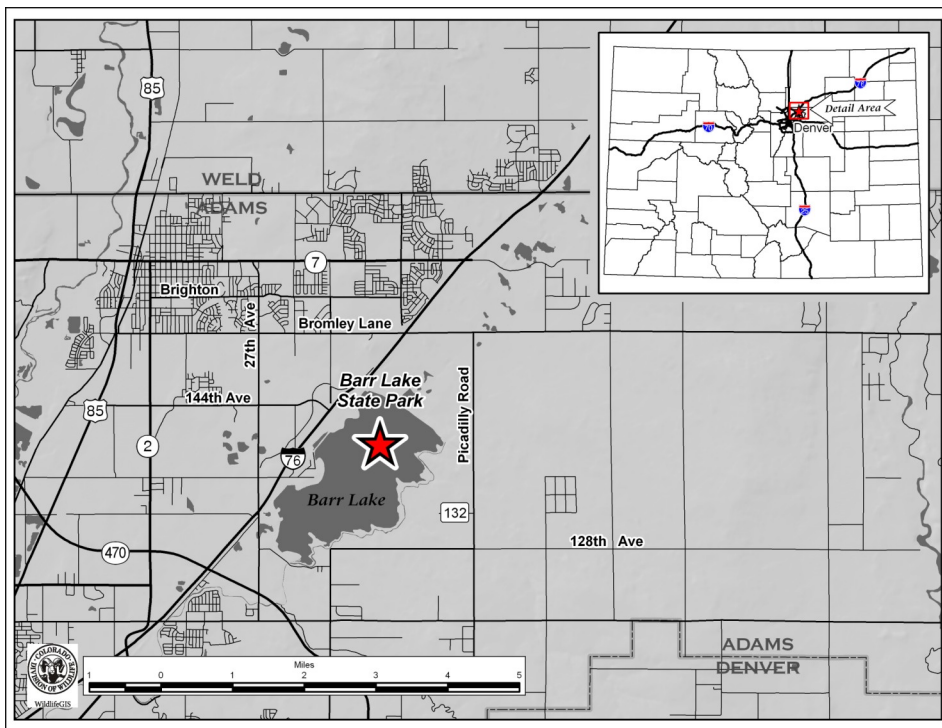


Barr Lake State Park





Barr Lake State Park Adams County

From Denver, take I-76 northeast, exit on Bromley Lake. Go east to Picadilly Road, then south to the park entrance.

From E-470 exit 34, 120th Ave, go east to Tower Road, turn left onto Tower Road and follow pavement to Picadilly Road. Make a left on Picadilly. Park entrance is about a mile ahead on the left.

Regulations:

Note: A State Parks Pass will be required to park in the parking lot near Rocky Mountain Bird Observatory – pass can be purchased on site at the self serve station in parking lot. Reservations will be available for Youth Duck hunting – Sept 24th.

- A. Only waterfowl hunting will be allowed and will be restricted to Saturdays and Wednesdays.
- B. All hunting is regulated by a reservation system and through a mandatory check station. Reservations may be made by calling 1-800-846-9453. Reservations are not accepted more than 14 days in advance of the hunt date, nor after 12:00 noon on the day before the hunt date. Hunters who wish to cancel a reservation must do so no later than 12:00 noon on the day before the hunt date. Failure to hunt a reserved area without prior cancellation may cause forfeiture of the privilege to make reservations for the remainder of the hunting season. Hunters are limited to a maximum of one reservation per hunt date and one reservation per phone call. Reservations are not transferable. The individual named on the reservation must be at the property on the day of the hunt and be a licensed hunter

for the species to be hunted. Hunters with reservations may only hunt the area specified on the reservation. Hunters must follow check-in and check-out procedures as posted.

- C. Hunters must check in and check out at the designated check station.
- D. Waterfowl hunting is restricted to designated blinds and the maximum number of hunters per blind is 3.
- E. Blinds that have not been reserved will be available on a first-come, first-serve basis after 5 a.m. on each hunting day. Reserved blinds unoccupied by 7:00 a.m. will be available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

In addition to or in place of those restrictions listed in regulation #900 the above listed provisions or restrictions apply (see Chapter 9, <http://wildlife.state.co.us/RulesRegs/Regulations/>).
